THE ORGANIZERS

“A world ruled by law, and not by force” has been the mission of the [World Jurist Association](#) since its founding in 1963. As a non-governmental organization with **special consultative status with the United Nations ECOSOC** (Economic and Social Council), the [WJA](#) was created to become a free and open forum for judges, lawyers, law professors, law students and other legal professionals from around the world to cooperate in strengthening and expanding the Rule of Law and its institutions. Amongst its main activities are the organization of the biannual World Law Congress and the presentation of the World Peace & Liberty Award.

As a result of the Madrid Declaration of 2019, the **World Law Foundation** was created as the executive arm to organize the main activities of the World Jurist Association. The [Board of Trustees](#) and the Advisory Board of the WLF are composed of prominent jurists and professionals, including former presidents and prime ministers, presidents of high courts, lawyers, academics, and businesspeople.

THE WORLD LAW CONGRESS

The [WLC](#) is a congress of congresses where different organizations and institutions hold their own panels. The Biennial Congress is the main event of the WJA. For three days, global leaders, including heads of State, justices from supranational and national courts, government officials, policy makers, academics, lawyers, activists, and students, discuss a wide variety of current topics to which the legal community should propose solutions.

The history of the World Law Congress is as extensive as the WJA’s history. It began in 1963 in Athens, and has continued, almost uninterrupted, every two years to this day.

The **WORLD LAW CONGRESS DOMINICAN REPUBLIC 2025** will be the 29th time this three-day event is being held. On the first day, the Opening Ceremony will take place at the historic Universidad Autónoma de Santo Domingo, the first university founded in the Americas in 1538. The second day, at the new building of Universidad del Caribe UNICARIBE, will feature more than 300 speakers and panelists from 70+ countries across the five continents, who will discuss multiple topics, from AI regulation to independence of the judiciary to challenges in corporate practice.

Finally, on the third day, during the Closing Ceremony the **World Peace & Liberty Award 2025** will be presented to **Sonia Sotomayor**, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States of America. This award has been previously presented to Sir Winston Churchill, Nelson Mandela, René Cassin, Felipe VI King of Spain, Ruth Bader Ginsburg, the Colombian people, represented by the then President Ivan Duque, US civil rights leader Andrew Young and the European Commission, received by President Ursula von der Leyen.



Letter from Javier Cremades

President of the World Jurist Association and the World Law Foundation



On behalf of the World Jurist Association (WJA), I would like to extend a warm welcome to the delegations coming from all continents to participate in the World Law Congress Dominican Republic 2025.

For the first time, the Dominican Republic is hosting the best global conversation on the legal challenges facing humanity. A total of 300 top international panelists from more than 70 countries will analyze some of the most important challenges currently facing the rule of law in the world.

On the occasion of this Congress, the WJA presents the World Peace & Liberty Award, considered by many to be the Nobel Prize in Law, to US Supreme Court Associate Justice Sonia Sotomayor. The ceremony will also be attended by His Majesty the King of Spain, Felipe VI, and the President of the German Federal Constitutional Court Stephan Harbarth, accompanied by nearly 30 presidents of constitutional and supreme courts, presidents of the American Bar Association (ABA) and of the most important international bar associations, deans of the most important universities in the world, notaries and registrars from several continents, presidents and heads of government, businessmen, media and students from the main universities of the Dominican Republic. This award was received by Sir Winston Churchill, Nelson Mandela, Rene Cassin, principal drafter of the United Nations Declaration of Human Rights, H.M. King Felipe VI of Spain, US Supreme Court Associate Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, President of the European Commission Ursula von der Leyen; the Colombian society represented by the then President Ivan Duque, on the occasion of the 40th anniversary of its Constitution; Andrew Young, civil rights leader in the US and closest collaborator of Martin Luther King Jr, among others.

The choice of the Dominican Republic to host this international event is also a tribute to Dominican society and institutions, on the occasion of the 15th anniversary of the creation of the Constitutional Court; the 180th anniversary of the Supreme Court of Justice of the Dominican Republic, and the 515th anniversary of the First Royal Court in America, inspired by the defense of human dignity and respect for legality in the exercise of public power.

The choice of the Dominican Republic as the host country for this great event was announced by Luis Henry Molina, President of the Supreme Court of Justice of the Dominican Republic, at the United Nations headquarters in New York, during the closing ceremony of the last World Law Congress, held in 2023. The announcement was made in the presence of H.M. the King of Spain, Felipe VI, the Prime Minister of Canada Justin Trudeau, the President of Colombia Iván Duque, Ursula von der Leyen, President of the European Commission, the President of Ecuador Guillermo Lasso, and several heads of state.

On this occasion, and for the first time as well, the WJA has wanted to make room for an important participation of young people, with the registration of more than 600 young Dominicans who will attend this Congress under the theme “New Generations & Rule of Law. Shaping the Future”.

Never before has WJA so directly linked youth and universities in this global campaign for the defense of the rule of law. To make this possible, the WJA would like to express its recognition and gratitude to the Dominican society and its institutions, especially to UNICARIBE and its Chancellor José Alejandro Aybar, our main partner throughout this last year of organizing the Congress; to the Universidad Autónoma de Santo Domingo, the Universidad Primada de América, and to the other universities that have been actively involved in this great event. In this way, the WJA wishes to highlight the commitment that society has with the youngest members of society as an essential part of humanity's effort to strengthen the rule of law as a guarantor of the dignity of the person, in the certainty that the rule of law is the only civilized alternative to the rule of force.

With this emphasis on youth, the World Jurist Association wishes to remind us that we all have a responsibility to transmit to new generations both the virtues and the challenges facing the rule of law. History reminds us that when

the rule of law fails, freedom and democracy falter, and the most basic rights to life, honor and property of citizens are threatened.

And we do so in the place where the seeds of Western legal civilization were first sown in the New World.

As a lasting tribute by the WJA to the Dominican Republic's commitment to the rule of law, democracy and fundamental freedoms, at the end of this Congress, the Malecón of the city of Santo Domingo will host an important work of art by artist Carlos Albert. This tribute also wants to honor the enduring legacy of the School of Salamanca, which transformed the conception of law, economics and politics from the intrinsic dignity of every person. Its influence was decisive for the birth of international law, human rights and the market economy. The School of Salamanca spread throughout Europe, America and Asia, and its spirit was embodied in the first universities of the American continent. From them, jurists and theologians trained in Salamanca sowed in America the ideals of natural law, justice and respect for human dignity. The Dominican Republic has witnessed, amidst the inevitable vicissitudes of history, the establishment of the rule of law and its continuity, from the first Royal Court of America to the constitutional courts of today; from the word of Francisco de Vitoria to the global legal debate of today.

This Congress always wants to remember that the rule of law is not only a form of government, but a spiritual conquest that unites free peoples and makes them responsible for a just and humane order.

Finally, I invite you to participate in the next edition of the World Law Congress 2027, which will be held in the Republic of Albania, and in which we will have the opportunity to take part in the largest global conversation on the challenges and opportunities that the Rule of Law faces, as one of the essential foundations for the development of peoples, in peace and freedom.

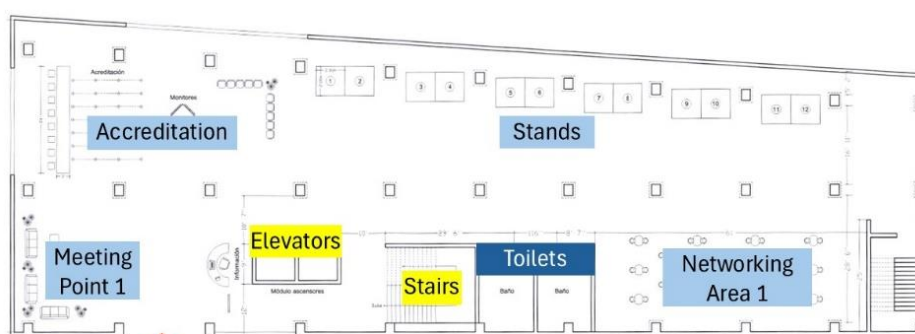

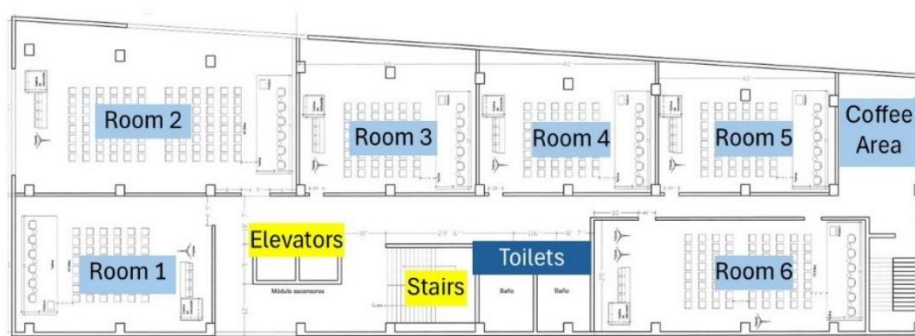

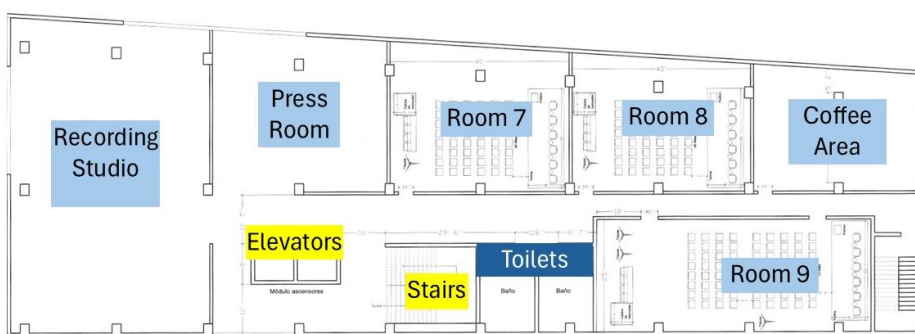
MAY 5 - UNICARIBE FLOOR PLAN



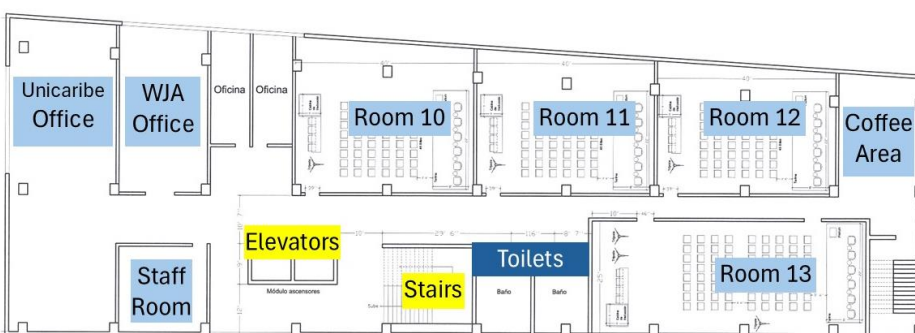
